Carillonneur

Daniel Kerry Kehoe has a carillon career spanning 38 years. He began playing in September 1974 while a student at Trinity College. He initially studied with carillonneur Raymond Keldermans in his home town of Springfield, Illinois. College summers were spent as a performing tourguide at the Rees Carillon in Springfield, where he has twice returned to perform in the International Carillon Festival. From 1982 until 2007 Mr. Kehoe was the first appointed College Carillonneur at Trinity College in Hartford, Connecticut. He joined the music staff of the Simsbury United Methodist Church in July 2007.

In 1978 he studied briefly with Mr. Piet van den Broek at the Royal Carillon School in Mechelen, Belgium. Since that time Mr. Kehoe has performed extensively on towers

throughout New England and the eastern seaboard. He has recorded two albums on the carillon, "Summer Sounds at Seven" and "A Carillon Christmas," and is a Carillonneur member of the Guild of Carillonneurs in North America.
